Letter to T.B. Wemyss

Letter written by Sgt W.F. Spencer, Fourth Imperial Bushmen's Contingent, 24 January 1901 on active service

Transvaal Welverdiend September 6 1900

Dear Sir,

I now take the pencile in hand to write you a few lines to let you know that I am well. I am at Welverdiend now we have been on the March ever since we landed untill about a week ago we are having a rest here fore a while there are only about 40 of us here the rest have gone on to Pretoria we are going there shortely. we have had a pretty hard time since we have been out here we havent had a bit of bread since we we landed only hard bisquits. We have had Seventeen Engagements since we came out we have had five men killed and thirteen wounded out of the fourth Contingent one of them is going to be burried today Trooper E Mitchel he was shot dead while on a patroll they ran right into the Boers before they saw them and they opened fire on them there was only five of our men and there was fifteen Boers so they had to retire and they shot him dead they dident hit any one else they cant shot much they are better at a long range than a short one I have had the dust knocked in my face from the bullets they have gone jolly close to me at times I had my horse shot from under me War isent a very nice game there are better games than war but still I dont mind it I like it alright I could shoot Boers all day its good sport. there is some talk about us going to England after the War I hope they do take us there I might go home if they dont take us I would like to go to England before I go back. we havent had a letter since we landed I am longing to get some knews our Contingent is terrably scattered now we had three men killed in one day it was a big battle we had that day that was the day my horse was shot we were nearly captured about 30 of us they tried to cut us off they got





within a hundered yards of us. I have got a very good horse now. I have been in every engagement so far the bullets has hit all around me they have gone within a few inches of me but they cant hit me they are bad shots. remember me to Elle tell her I will come and see her when I get back if the Boers dont kill me before then. I wouldent mind going to China for a while to fight the chows it would be better than fighting the Boers. We had to go out last night and search all the houses for about six miles out to see if there was any boers in them we had to search every corner and under the beds and every little place we started out at eleven Oclock and got back at five oclock in the morning but we dident catch any of them. the Boers dont like the Australians at all they call them all sorts of names they say they would sooner fight two Englishmen than one Australian you must excuse the paper being dirty it is the only envelope I have left this is all the news this time remember me to all.
