









Letter to Josiah Pitcher from John Pitcher, 1838 D 4708/1(L)

North Adelaide November 1838

My dear brother i have sent you these few lines hoping to find you are in good health as it leaves me at preasant. i received y-the box of Apples which you sent me but it was so long before i got them after Landing that they were All spoilt but the Arthechoks and the vines were in good condishon i gave All the vines and Arthechoks to M^r Jones for which he is very proud ofthe vines espechly and sends best thanks to you for them M^{rs} Jones is coming to Launceston in about three weeks from this date

if you have not bought the plaints [plaints?] do not by them Altho i can get a good profit on them but i am afraid you will not get good wones but you are a bit of a [... ...] [deleted] Macanak i had for got it get the minla hats $\$ if posable i hope you hav received the News

papers which I sent o by robert Mills and a Letter Also a Letter by Captin Price i hope M^{rs} Pitcher is well and billy i have got the Rabits and they are doing well i mean to come to Launceston in About
